2023 School Year

We are all very excited about 2023 and are already planning various events and opportunities for our whole school community to come together throughout the year. Some of these will include Coffee and Cake mornings, Art Show, various whole school sporting events, Grand Opening of our oval, Open Mornings/Afternoons and various dress up and themed days.

Over the Christmas holidays we received several new enrolments, bringing our current enrolment number to 348. Tuesday was also the first day for our new Foundation students and it was so nice to see how confident, happy and ready they were. I would also like to acknowledge our older students across the school, especially the Year 5/6 students for making sure the Foundation students were looked after during recess and lunch time.



The first few weeks all students will participate in our whole school 'Start Up' program, where social and academic expectations are revised and explicitly taught, guided by our school values of **Aspire**, **Respect**, **Responsibility and Resilience**.

All classes will begin and end each day with a Community circle which comes from our Berry Street
Training and helps set the students up for a successful and positive day and help them to connect with
the class. This is one of the reasons why we emphasise the importance of punctuality and being on time.
Often students who are late feel anxious or unsure of what the daily expectations are.
Students are expected to be in class ready for learning by the time the 9.00am bell rings. All students
who arrive after the 9.00am bell need to go through the office to sign in using Compass Kiosk and receive a late pass. This is very important for legal reasons and our duty of care and thank you in advance
for your support with reinforcing this.

Holiday Works

Over the holidays we had several trades people completing works around the school. Classrooms in Building A (Administration and Senior Classes) and the Chill Out room were painted, roof repairs to Building A were completed as well as the usual grounds maintenance and whole school cleaning.



You may have noticed that works to the oval were halted, as unfortunately when 'Reliance' removed the soil required, it was still found to be wet and unstable. Further investigations have been carried out and they will be using a stabilisation

process recommended by the new soil report. While it is disappointing that works have been delayed slightly, it is better in the long run to ensure we get the best outcome for our oval.

The final completion date for the oval is May 19th and we look forward to organising a whole school community Grand Opening.

Communication

All communication, newsletters, student reports, permission and payments for excursions and incursions is through Compass. It is very important that parents can access this, so you do not miss any important information. If you are not sure how to use Compass, or need assistance, please come and see Kelly in the Office. Currently, classroom teachers use See Saw to share more day to day things and student work, however we will be transitioning to do this through Compass also throughout this year.

Last year, Ben spent a lot of time working with a provider updating our school Website. This is still a work in progress, however we also hope to share and use this more effectively as a communication tool with our families and broader community. We are currently working through the process of purchasing and installing a digital sign which will be situated on the Corner of Ronald Grove and Henry Street.

Classrooms will be open from 8.45am for students to unpack their bag and say good morning to their teacher. This is an opportunity and we encourage parents, where they can, to look at the work their child has been doing with them. Teachers are often busy preparing for the day and we ask parents to make a suitable time after school to discuss any concerns they may have. This will allow teachers to have sufficient time to address your concerns properly and privately. Teachers can be emailed through Compass and will respond when they have the opportunity. Please allow a day for teachers to respond as they attend meetings etc after school.







Canteen and Lunch

During Term 4 last year School Council advertised for the canteen position. We have received several Expressions of Interest and will be organising to meet and appoint someone during Term 1. We will continue to pursue the company who can provide healthy choices to align with our school values and vision. I am always impressed with the healthy brain food students bring and thank families for supporting this.



Beginning immediately students will be required to finish eating all food inside, including at recess time. This is to help make sure students are eating their healthy food, reduce the rubbish in the yard

(we encourage nude foods) and also reduce the risk of students sharing food and putting those students with allergies at higher risk.

Please encourage healthy lunches and limiting the amount of sugary foods you pack in your child's lunch. If you need to bring your child their lunch, please bring it to the office and we will ensure they receive it.

We have several students throughout the school who have severe and anaphylactic reactions to some foods. While we cannot and it is not recommended that we 'ban' items, we do ask you to be aware of the foods that have a higher risk of causing anaphylaxis such as: all nuts, eggs and milk and not include them in your child's lunch.

Inter-school Swimming 2023 (Years 3-6)

This year's Buckley District Interschool Swimming Carnival for students in Years 3-6 will be held on Monday 27th of February, at Queens Park Swimming Pool, Essendon.

On that day, participants will be asked to make their own way with a parent/guardian and arrive at Queen's Park Swimming Pool to be signed in with Mr Matton between 9.30-9.40 am, and be picked up from the venue at 1.30 pm. Your child will be supervised by KHPS staff at all times. Parents/Guardians are welcome to stay and spectate if they choose

In order for students to qualify for this event, we will need to hold KHPS 50m swimming trials at the East Keilor Leisure Centre, Quinn Grove, Keilor East, on Monday the 13th of February after school between 3.45-5.00pm.

It is expected that students wishing to trial are competent in their stroke and are capable of swimming a competitive time. Generally these are students who swim in squads or have many years of swimming experience.

There will be a cost of \$5 for students to participate in the trials. If you wish for your year 3-6 child to take part in the trials on Monday, February 13th, please contact either the office or Mr Matton in person, or through Compass no later than 5.00 pm, Monday 7th of February to express your child's interest. You will then be sent a permission form for the trials via Compass.

All events at the carnival are 50m and students are able to qualify for two individual events (out of Freestyle, Backstroke, Breaststroke and Butterfly) as well as the Freestyle relay (this is the only relay option available and is subject to having enough swimmers to put a team together) in the age groups as follows:

Boys 8/9/10 year olds (born 2013/2014/2015)

Girls 8/9/10 year olds (born 2013/2014/2015)

Boys 11 year olds (born 2012)

Girls 11 year olds (born 2012)

Boys 12/13 year olds (born 2010/2011)

Girls 12/13 year olds (born 2010/2011)

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent,
 and:
- submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- · Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23 June 2023.
