Walking School Bus

The Walking School Bus is a fantastic government initiative which promotes a healthy and safe way for children to get to school, while also reducing congestion on our roads. Over recent months I have been discussing the possibility of KHPS to become involved with local council. Our school chaplain Riley has been in further communication and will help to establish this program in the near future at KHPS. Please see page 3 & page 18 for more information.

School Wide Positive Behaviour

Children come to school to experience and learn about a variety of things, (academic, social/emotional) so that they are equipped with the tools and strategies for future life experiences.

Our School Wide Positive Behaviour Model focuses on explicitly teaching the expected behaviours and how to be inclusive and respectful of others and by acknowledging students positively when they demonstrate these behaviours. From time to time

students will have differences and might not always respond the way we would like them to. When this happens teachers will talk to all students who are involved and work through the solution and appropriate consequence if required. We encourage students to let us know if they are experiencing difficulties so that we can work with them to improve the situation. We also ask parents to act respectfully and come directly to the classroom teacher if they have any concerns about their child for academic, social or emotional reasons. We do not condone parents speaking directly to other parents about what they might perceive another child to be doing, or to any students.



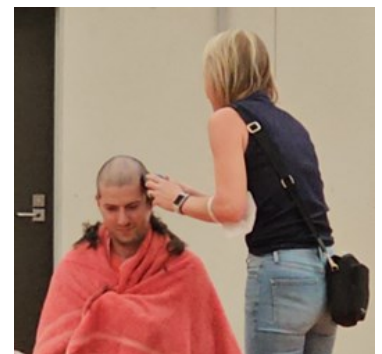
Annual Implementation Plan

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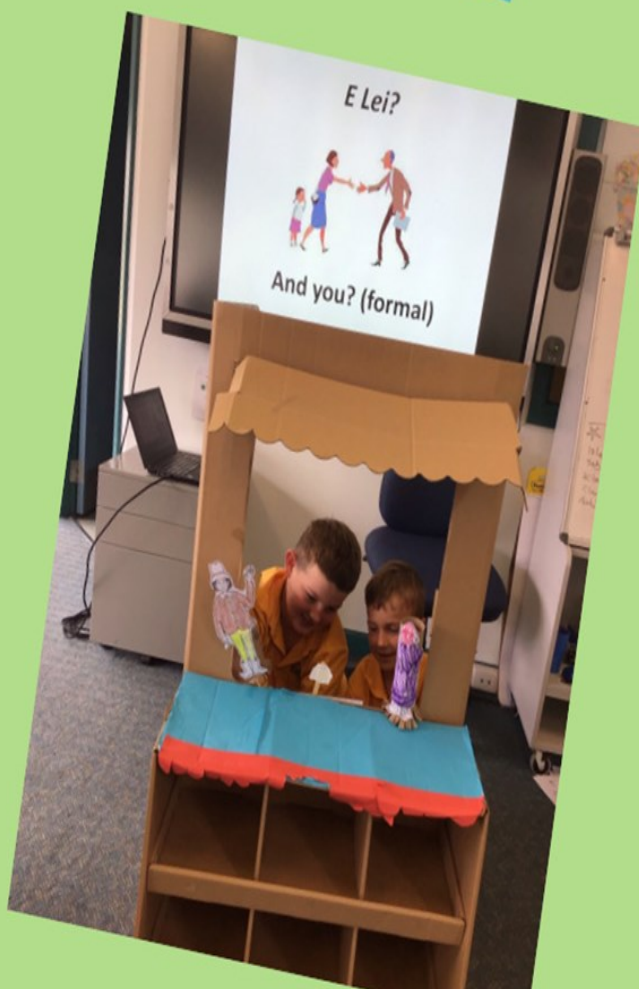
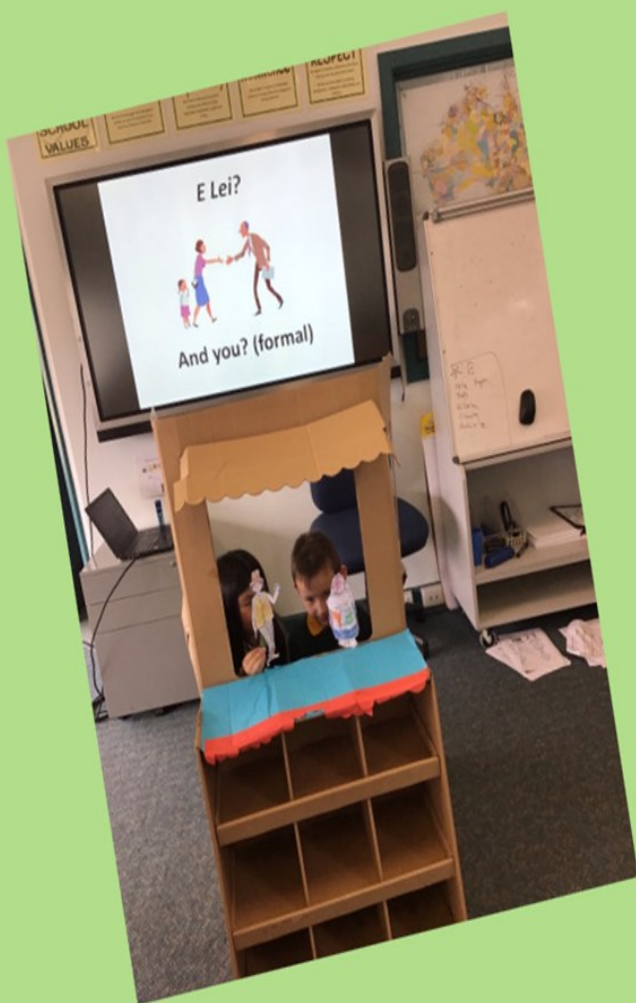

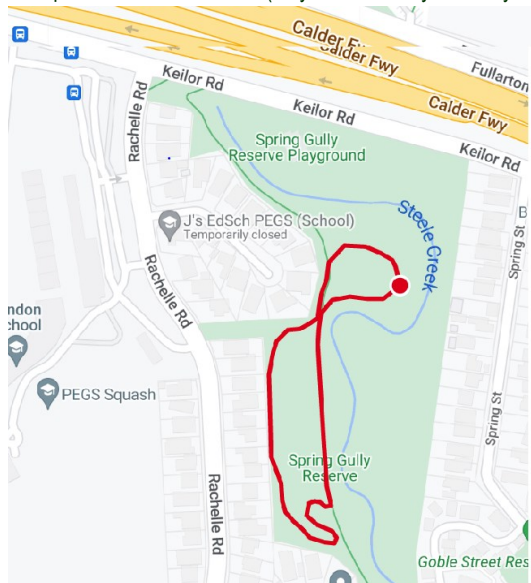

KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials (Years 3-6)

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This year's **KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials** for students in years 3-6 will take place on Tuesday, April 4th. On this day, all students and teachers in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will walk down to Steele's Creek/Spring Gully Reserve in Keilor East (near Valley Lakes) to complete either the 2km run (10 years old this year and younger) or 3km (11 years old this year and older).



Students turning 10 years old or under in 2023 (born 2013, 2014 and 2015) will complete 3 x laps of approximately 670m (2km).

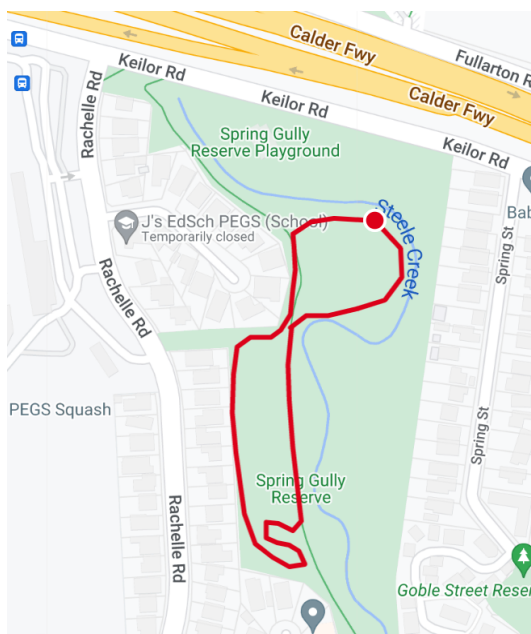
Every lap completed of the circuit will earn house points, in addition to extra points being awarded for the top 10 finishers, which will go towards awarding the House Cross-Country Shield for 2023.

The event is also a qualification opportunity for students (top 6 in each age group/gender) who are keen runners and have ambitions to represent KHPS at the Buckley District Cross-Country Event which will be held in Term 2, Week 2 at Brimbank Park..

Students may have different goals on the day but the focus will be on having fun, being active, and doing their best to run/walk as many laps as they can in the allocated time.

On the day, Year 3/4 students (10 years and under) will walk down with their teachers promptly at 9.10am and return to school at approximately 11.00am. Year 5/6 students (11 years old and older) will walk down with their teachers at 10.15am and return to school at approximately 12.00pm.

In the case of students in Year 4 who are turning or have turned 11 in 2023, or Year 5 who are turning or have turned 10 in 2023, students will be asked prior to the day to choose whether they want to run for fun (and walkdown) with their class/peer group, or run to compete and trial for interschool cross-country (and walkdown) with their age group.



Students turning 11 years old in 2023 (born 2012) and students turning 12 or 13 years old in 2023 (born 2010 or 2011) will complete 4 x laps of approximately 750m (3km)

10 and under girls (Generally Years 3 and 4)	9.40-10.10
10 and under boys (Generally Years 3 and 4)	10.15-10.45
11 years old- girls and boys (Generally Yr 5)	10.55-11.25
12/13 years old- girls and boys (Gen Yr 6)	11.30-12.00

You will previously have signed the local walking excursion permission form which is sufficient for students attending this event. A reminder was sent out via Compass recently to a small number of families who had not given consent and this needs to be actioned prior to the day.

Students are encouraged to wear appropriate clothing for physical activity that also displays their house colours. If your child does not have anything to wear, face paint, headbands, hair accessories etc. are alternative ways to demonstrate house pride. Students will

need to take a water bottle and sun smart hat along to the event, and are encourage to apply sunscreen prior to coming to school.

Parents and guardians are welcome to come down and spectate but will need to remain at the assembly area/start & finish line while students are competing in their events.

Some parent helpers may be required so if you are able to provide assistance throughout the morning then please let Mr Matton know in person or via Compass beforehand.

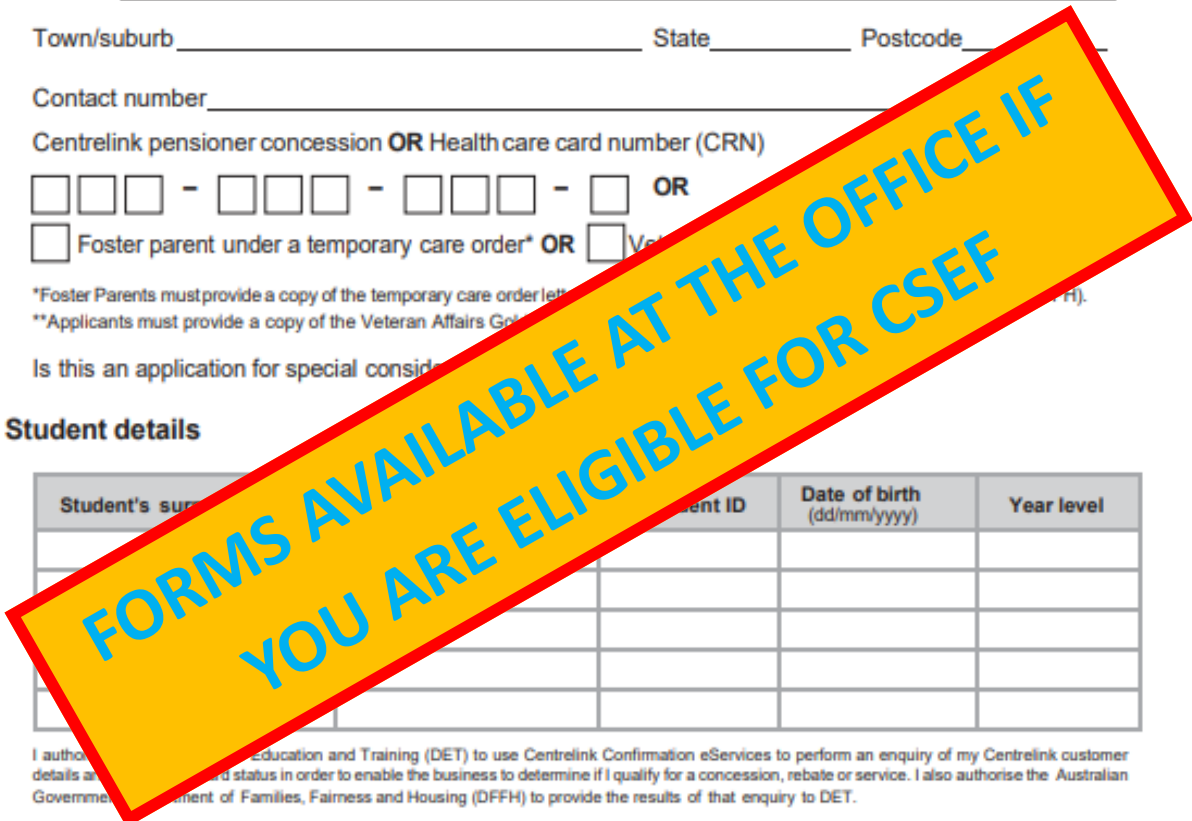

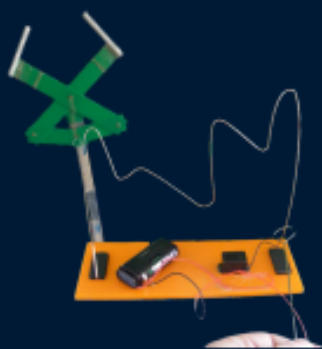

What is the Walking School Bus?

The Walking School Bus™ is a fun, healthy and safe way for primary school aged children to travel to and from school. Run in collaboration with VicHealth, Moonee Valley City Council, schools, traders and community groups, this free program has far reaching benefits.

The Walking School Bus™ (WSB) is not a real vehicle, but a group of children who walk to school accompanied by two adult leaders (one 'driver' and one 'conductor'). Picking up and delivering children at 'bus stops' on the way to school.

The Walking School Bus follows a specific route on specific days selected by your school and volunteers. These routes have been carefully planned by the volunteer coordinator and audited by Council to ensure the safety of the children. Safety precautions include a 1:8 adult to children ratio. All volunteers are expected to undergo safety training, registration and hold a Working with Children Check (WWC). Moonee Valley City Council is supporting this fantastic program at no cost to schools or families.

Volunteers

All volunteers are provided with training through Moonee Valley City Council and are required to undergo a WWC to ensure that children are walked to school in a safe and friendly manner. Volunteers are expected to operate according to the bus stop timetable and follow appropriate safety measures.

Council

Moonee Valley City Council employs a Project Officer to supervise the WSB program. The Project Officer provides administrative support and guidance to all participants. It is Council's responsibility to conduct WSB route safety audits, register volunteers and provide safety training.
