# 5/6 Biological Science Adaptations Presentations

As part of our Biological Science unit, students have been learning about animals and their adaptations. Students have been delivering engaging presentations about a chosen animal, learning how to use digital tools to engage their audience and teach them something new. Here are some photos comments about what's been happening in our classrooms!



We are doing an animal adaptations project. I chose to do my project on the Rattle Snake. It adapts to its environment by having cold blood. This allows it to cool down. It warms itself up by laying in the sun. Daniel C – 5/6D



Our task was to choose an animal and research how it adapts to its environment. My animal was the Red Panda. One of the ways the Red Panda adapts, is it wakes up every few hours and looks for food. This allows it to use as little energy as possible. They use as much energy as a Sloth!

For the past 2 weeks, 5/6 students have been working on different adaptation projects. We researched structural, behavioural and physiological adaptations and then presented them to our classes. An example of an animal adaptation was polar bears from the arctic regions. We also learnt about starfish, blue-tongued lizards, arctic fox, zebras and many more animals. 


Our school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10km's of the school, or search for our school by name.
