S.W.P.B.S. (School Wide Positive Behaviour Support)

Walking around the school it is great to see many of our wonderful students displaying our school values, inside classrooms and when out at play. I recently conducted a random student survey as part of tracking our school's S.W.P.B.S. implementation and 11 of the 12 students surveyed could name all 4 school values, that's pretty impressive! Of these same students, 11 could recall receiving at least one KHOIN for their positive behaviour and recall what they received it for. Students represented all grades from F to 6. Positive data so far!

The competition questions are set in modern, real-world scenarios where school students are assessed on their ability to apply classroom learning to new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. The subjects span literacy (English, Writing and Spelling Bee) and Mathematics.


Interest for ICAS was emailed this week via Compass, for those students wishing to participate in the assessments offered.


