It's hard to believe we are halfway through Term 4. Lots happening and plenty more excitement to come as we prepare for the Arts and Cultural Show, farewell our Year 6 students and focus on transitioning our students and staff into 2024. Some our Year 3/4 students are off to camp for the first time and it's exciting to welcome new families as they transition into Foundation throughout the term. During this busy time we understand members of our school community may feel anxious about the unknown, so it is important that we focus on personal wellbeing and keep in mind our school values when aiming for success.



In the past month we sent another team of teachers to Berry Street Training. They have returned with a wealth of knowledge that is being shared with other staff and implemented in the classroom setting. Staff also enjoy commencing weekly PLC meetings with a Brain Break activity and Welcome circle, often testing their own skills and enjoying a laugh with one another.



The Respectful Relationships topic this term is Gender and Identity.

In these weekly sessions students have explored their own personal identities, including strengths, preferred activity choices and likes/dislikes. Students compared their preferences with their peers and investigated how these comparisons are similar or different to others.

In addition to this, students have investigated gender stereotypes in the social environment and in literature. Through this analysis, students are

learning to make decisions and recommendations for a more equitable society, where they have opportunities to fulfil their goals and desires in education and the wider community.

Students demonstrate respect for a diverse range of people and groups, and describe factors that contribute to positive relationships with their peers. They explore how we label aspects of society, whether it be classifying people, animals or objects and that labels do not tell us everything, but are just a way of sorting information which may not always be correct.

Respectful Relationships education is a core component of the Victorian Curriculum from Foundation to Year 12. It is all about embedding a culture of respect and equality across the entire school community.




























Interschool Athletics Update




