

Inter-school Swimming 2024 (Years 3-6)

Next year's Buckley District Interschool Swimming Carnival for students in Years 3-6 will be held on Monday 26th of February, at Oak Park Sports and Aquatic Centre, Pascoe Vale.

On that day, participants will be required to make their own way with a parent/guardian and arrive at the pool to be signed in with Mr Matton between 9.30-9.40 am and be picked up from the venue at 1.30 pm. Your child will be supervised by KHPS staff at all times. Parents/Guardians are welcome to stay and spectate if they choose.

In order for students to qualify for this event, we will need to hold KHPS 50m swimming trials at the East Keilor Leisure Centre, Quinn Grove, Keilor East, on Monday the 12th of February (to be confirmed) after school between 3.45-5.00pm.

It is expected that students wishing to trial are competent in their stroke and are capable of swimming a competitive time. Generally these are students who swim in squads or have many years of swimming experience.

There will be a pool entry cost for students to participate in the trials. If you wish for your Year 3-6 child to take part in the trials, please contact either the office or Mr Matton in person, or through Compass no later than 5.00 pm, by Wednesday 7th of February to express your child's interest. At that time, you will then be sent a permission form for the trials via Compass.

All events at the carnival are 50m and students are able to qualify for two individual events (out of Freestyle, Backstroke, Breaststroke and Butterfly) as well as the Freestyle relay (this is the only relay option available and is subject to having enough swimmers to put a team together) in the age groups as follows:

Boys 8/9/10 year olds (born 2014/2015/2016)

Girls 8/9/10 year olds (born 2014/2015/2016)

Boys 11 year olds (born 2013)

Girls 11 year olds (born 2013)

Boys 12/13 year olds (born 2011/2012)

Girls 12/13 year olds (born 2011/2012)




