NAPLAN – Week 7 & Week 8

This Year, NAPLAN for Year 3 and Year 5 students will be held during Weeks 7 & 8, Wednesday 13th - Wednesday 20th March. A parent Information brochure was sent home through Compass to those families whose children will be participating. It is important to recognise that students are being assessed regularly throughout the year and this is just another form of assessment. We use the results to moderate against classroom work and

other assessments to work out where your child is working against the curriculum and then co-create future learning goals. If you do have any queries or concerns about your child participating in NAPLAN testing, then please speak to your child's classroom teacher, Rosie or myself.

End of Day Pick Up

We ask parents not to come into the school grounds before 3.15pm please. Part of our OHS and Child Safety Compliance is that we know who is onsite during the school day. I have also been made aware that on occasions parents are taking younger siblings to the student toilets during school hours which is a breach of our Child Safe Standards Compliance.

If your younger child does need to go to the toilet while you are waiting to pick up your school age child, please come to the office and we can show you to a toilet in the Administration area. We try to protect our student's learning time where possible and ask if you do need to give your child a forgotten drink bottle, lunch, reader etc during the day that you come to the office and we will pass it on.

Last year we had our School Review so this year will be the first year of our New Strategic Plan, with new priorities, goals and targets. NUMBER INVESTIGATIONS WITH THE 3/4S








KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials (Years 3–6)– 26th of March


This year's **KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials** for students in years 3-6 will take place on Tuesday, March 26th (last week of term 1). On this day, all students and teachers in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will walk down to Steele's Creek/Spring Gully Reserve in Keilor East (near Valley Lakes) to complete either the 2km run (10 years old this year and younger) or 3km (11 years old this year and older).



Students turning 10 years old or younger in 2024 (born 2014, 2015 and 2016) will complete 3 x laps of approximately 670m (2km). Every lap completed of the circuit shown will earn house points which will go towards awarding the House Cross-Country Shield for 2024.

The event is also a qualification opportunity for students (top 6 in each age group/gender) who are keen runners and have ambitions to represent KHPS at the Buckley District Cross-Country Event which will be held in Term 2, Week 4 at Brimbank Park.

Students may have different goals on the day but the focus will be on having fun, being active, and doing their best to run/walk as many laps as they can in the allocated time.



Students turning 11 years old in 2024 (born 2013) and students turning 12 or 13 years old in 2024 (born in 2011 or 2012) will complete 4 x laps of approximately 750m (3km)

For those students who are keen competitors and wish to qualify for the interschool crosscountry team and take it right up to other schools in our sports district, they may wish to start training (with parent/guardian supervision) on the courses shown left.



I understand that:

 DFFH or Centrelink will use information I have provided to DE to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DE personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.

This consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.

I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DFFH and provide it to my child's school so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions
Fund can be determined.

If I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions
Fund provided by DE.

Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to DFFH and/or State Schools Relief for the purpose
of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.
