Allergy Awareness Professional Learning

This week, staff attended an Allergy Awareness Training session, facilitated by Jackie Nevard.

Some of the key messaging was how to minimise risks by not sharing foods and hand hygiene, whole school community awareness and safe alternate options to promote inclusiveness. This is a timely reminder for parents to discuss the importance of not sharing foods with other students. While we do not and it is not recommended for us to 'ban' food products, we sometimes ask parents to refrain from packing certain foods in their child's lunch if there may be a child in that class who is anaphylactic.





NAPLAN - Week 8

This year, NAPLAN for Year Three and Year Five students will be held during Week 8, Wednesday 13th March - Wednesday 20th March. A Parent Information Brochure was sent home through Compass to those families whose children will be participating. It is important to recognise that students are being assessed regularly throughout the year



and this is just another form of assessment. We use the results to moderate against classroom work and other assessments to work out where your child is working against the curriculum and then co-create future learning goals.

If you do have any queries or concerns about your child participating in NAPLAN testing, then please speak to your child's classroom teacher, Rosie or myself.



RESILIENC

As the first month of school comes to a close we reflect on the wonderful things that are well underway at KHPS. The Start Up Programs are now complete, where classes set routines, explored learning and behaviour expectations and most importantly, built relationships with students and peers. Through an Inclusive Classrooms approach we endeavour to provide rich learning experiences that engage our learners in a variety of ways, taking into consideration student voice and the belief that students learn at different rates and in different ways.

SWPBS

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a school-wide framework for teaching, modelling and reinforcing appropriate and positive behaviours. Learning and behaviour expectations are clearly defined in each classroom and are aligned to our school values of RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, RESILIENCE and ASPIRE. Positive behaviours are promoted and acknowledged, using recognition and reward systems, with an aim of preventing problem behaviours before they arise.

Programs & Supports



The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) provides strategies for teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve all students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement.



Respectful Relationships education is a core component of the Victorian Curriculum. It is an initiative to support schools and early childhood education settings to promote and model respect and equality. It also supports educators to teach our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience, and confidence. The Resilience, Rights and

Respectful Relationships program is assessed in the Victorian Curriculum areas of Personal and Social Capability and Health and Physical Education. Topics covered are:

- Emotional Literacy
- Personal Strengths
- Positive Coping
- Problem Solving
- Stress Management

- Help-Seeking
- Gender and Identity
- Positive Gender Relations



Cyber Safety is an integral part of our Learning Technologies program at Keilor Heights PS. Students from Foundation—Year 6 are taught how to use technology and the internet in a safe and responsible way. Cyber safety is a team effort between the student, family and school.

Lunchtime Clubs & Play Leaders

We are currently in the process of setting up the Chill Out Space and organising Lunchtime Clubs for our students who wish to do alternative activities than out in the yard.




KHPS House Gozz-Country/Buckley District Interschool Gozz-Country Trials (Years 3-6) - 26th of March

This year's KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials for students in years 3-6 will take place on Tuesday, March 26th (last week of term 1). On this day, all students and teachers in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will walk down to Steele's Creek/Spring Gully Reserve in Keilor East (near Valley Lakes) to complete either the 2km run (10 years old this year and younger) or 3km (11 years old this year and older).



Students turning 10 years old or younger in 2024 (born 2014, 2015 and 2016) will complete 3 x laps of approximately 670m (2km). Every lap completed of the circuit shown will earn house points which will go towards awarding the House Cross-Country Shield for 2024.

The event is also a qualification opportunity for students (top 6 in each age group/gender) who are keen runners and have ambitions to represent KHPS at the Buckley District Cross-Country Event which will be held in Term 2, Week 4 at Brimbank Park.



Students turning 11 years old in 2024 (born 2013) and students turning 12 or 13 years old in 2024 (born in 2011 or 2012) will complete 4 x laps of approximately 750m (3km) Students may have different goals on the day but the focus will be on having fun, being active, and doing their best to run/walk as many laps as they can in the allocated time.

For those students who are keen competitors and wish to qualify for the interschool cross-country team and take it right up to other schools in our sports district, they may wish to start training (with parent/guardian supervision) on the courses shown left.




