

LEST WE FORGET

Ansac Day

They provided a brief overview of the importance of Anzac Day and then recited two poems, 'Ode of Remembrance' and 'In Flander's Fields', followed by a minute silence.

I attended my local service and hope that families either attended a service or were able to acknowledge in their own way this very important part of our culture.

#### **Curriculum Day/2024 Reporting Formats/STEM**

Today, teachers spent the day in Curriculum Teams, refining their action plans to include the goals and targets in our Annual Implementation Plan. This document has almost been completed and will be presented at our next school council meeting to be endorsed and then shared with the whole school community. There will be a continued focus on Numeracy, which is a statewide priority and also Inclusion and Wellbeing, Student Voice and Agency.



REPORTING



Teachers also worked on our new reporting format as we make a gradual shift towards an ongoing reporting system. This semester, there will be an additional area in the reports that will have a writing example. You will be provided with a brief synopsis of the task, including the areas teachers were assessing and then the feedback from teachers, indicating what your child has achieved and the next area for them to work on. You will also be able to view your child's writing so you can clearly see this.

Keilor Heights Primary School acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we meet and learn together, the Wurundjeri People of the Kulin Nation, and we recognise their enduring connection to the land, waters and culture. We pay our respects to their Elders past and present.



It is important to remember that this is only one piece of work and when teachers provide a progression point of where your child is, they use several forms of assessment. Specialists will also have a similar task, relevant to their subject area. This change has come from the surveys we conducted last year and to keep in line with current assessment and reporting practices. This type of ongoing reporting supports Student Voice and Agency, enabling students and parents to clearly see what they are currently able to achieve and what are future areas for development. It also promotes the partnership between school and home. We will continue to expand this as the year progresses.

In the afternoon, teachers spent time preparing for our STEM Family Open Afternoon – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May. Last Friday, Miss Megan attended a Professional Learning day at Melbourne University with EKC which she found extremely beneficial and has come back with lots of ideas for our STEM program.

#### **Essendon Keilor College Transition Day**

On Tuesday, our Year 5/6 students attended EKC for a transition and experience day, similar to the previous week where they attended Rosehill secondary College. Students again reported that they had a great time and participated in a number of specialist subjects, including Science, Cooking, PE and Art.



We encourage parents to attend any Information sessions or have a tour of Secondary Schools, so you can make your own informed decision about which school would be the best option for your child.

Transition information and what you need to do for enrolment at Secondary Schools will be coming out shortly.

#### **Incursion/Excursions/Camps**

There are quite a few incursions and excursions coming up or being planned. Teachers always look carefully into various options when choosing these to find the ones that compliment the learning students are currently doing and be mindful of the costs for families.



If you are finding it difficult to find the funds, please come and speak to us at the office.

The Year 5/6 students do have a number of exciting Leadership days coming up as we continue to expand our Leadership program, so that all students have an opportunity to develop these important life long skills. These include a whole day with Lorin Nicholson and his Climb Your Own Mountain Leadership Day and Peer Mediator and Play Leader Training. After attending these days, students will then apply these skills and facilitate various programs across the school with our younger students.

# ABOUT CAMP QUALITY'S CANCER EDUCATION PROGRAM

Camp Quality's Cancer Education Program has been teaching kids about cancer, with a fun and interactive puppet performance, for over 33 years. The program focuses on telling the broader cancer story, including how to support someone who is facing their own cancer diagnosis or that of a loved one.

The free Cancer Education Program visits primary schools and education and care services around Australia, and is shown to reduce bullying, absenteeism and the need for mental health support services for kids impacted by cancer. An independent KPMG report showed the total Social Return on Investment for the Cancer Education Program is \$5 for every \$1 spent.

The innovative program includes newly developed **Teacher Resource Packs** aligned to the Australian Curriculum, Early Years Learning Framework and state-based curriculums. Teacher lesson plans, classroom activities and our *Talking About Cancer* guide provide further learning on the social and emotional impacts of cancer. We also offer a free *Kids' Guide to Cancer* app that can be downloaded to your smartphone or tablet. Our resources have been developed in consultation with subject matter experts in the health and education sectors and they help to facilitate conversations about cancer.

Camp Quality puppeteers can perform up to three shows per day at your school, each with an audience of up to 350 students. There is no cost to the school or students. About the shows:

Ariel has a brain turnour. Her big brother Tom knows she's having a tough time in hospital, so today he's bringing her something he is sure will cheer her up straight away – an invitation to Lucy Carmichael's Bouncy Castle Birthday Party on Saturday! Only, Ariel can't go... how will she ever explain to the other kids why she doesn't have any hair, and why she's tired and skinny...? The Big Party, by Julianne O'Brien, is an empowering story, using interactive puppetry to teach us about cancer, and the importance of positivity and recognising our own strengths.

"It took away the stigma and fear of cancer. As we have a student at our school being treated for leukaemia, it helped the children understand what she is going through and why she has lost her hair. Having an understanding of the disease has certainly increased empathy in the other children too."






