Student Attitudes to School Survey

As well as quite a few events coming up this term, there are a number of Department surveys happening, including the Student Attitudes to School Survey.

NAPLAN

This week we received the preliminary NAPLAN results and have been advised that the confirmed results will follow shortly. We will advise families when we do receive these and also provide a summary of our school results to school council and the wider school

community. As NAPLAN moved to a different reporting system last year, some of the results are not comparable and the Department will be providing us with

further professional learning on how to interpret these results.

ABOUT CAMP QUALITY'S CANCER EDUCATION PROGRAM

Camp Quality's Cancer Education Program has been teaching kids about cancer, with a fun and interactive puppet performance, for over 33 years. The program focuses on telling the broader cancer story, including how to support someone who is facing their own cancer diagnosis or that of a loved one.

The free Cancer Education Program visits primary schools and education and care services around Australia, and is shown to reduce bullying, absenteeism and the need for mental health support services for kids impacted by cancer. An independent KPMG report showed the total Social Return on Investment for the Cancer Education Program is \$5 for every \$1 spent.

The innovative program includes newly developed **Teacher Resource Packs** aligned to the Australian Curriculum, Early Years Learning Framework and state-based curriculums. Teacher lesson plans, classroom activities and our *Talking About Cancer* guide provide further learning on the social and emotional impacts of cancer. We also offer a free *Kids' Guide to Cancer* app that can be downloaded to your smartphone or tablet. Our resources have been developed in consultation with subject matter experts in the health and education sectors and they help to facilitate conversations about cancer.

Camp Quality puppeteers can perform up to three shows per day at your school, each with an audience of up to 350 students. There is no cost to the school or students. About the shows:

Ariel has a brain turnour. Her big brother Tom knows she's having a tough time in hospital, so today he's bringing her something he is sure will cheer her up straight away – an invitation to Lucy Carmichael's Bouncy Castle Birthday Party on Saturday! Only, Ariel can't go... how will she ever explain to the other kids why she doesn't have any hair, and why she's tired and skinny..? The Big Party, by Julianne O'Brien, is an empowering story, using interactive puppetry to teach us about cancer, and the importance of positivity and recognising our own strengths.

"It took away the stigma and fear of cancer. As we have a student at our school being treated for leukaemia, it helped the children understand what she is going through and why she has lost her hair. Having an understanding of the disease has certainly increased empathy in the other children too."



Submit everything to the primary school by the due date (last Friday in July)
