### **Crazy Chemicals Incursion**

Today the Year 3-4's participated in a 'Crazy Chemicals' incursion, hosted by Supreme Incursions. The students participated in a variety of activities, linked to their current Inquiry topic exploring states of matter. Below are some factual recounts about the incursion.



On Thursday 23 of may all the 3/4s had a crazy chemical science incursion. The 3/4s started of with a little tour around our classroom. First 3/4B head into the 3/4B classroom because that was where it was placed at KHPS.

We started walking as a class to the classroom. We had two helpers that worked for supreme incursions. They were going to to introduce us to crazy chemicals. ### How to get involved

We are after recipes of all types of dishes, savory or sweet, that are at all skill levels, easy to advanced. They can be main style dishes, cultural/holiday recipes, allergy friendly, desserts, snacks, drinks, healthy or favourite dinner dishes – which can be included and printed for all our families to try at home and enjoy.

The recipes submitted will be collated into a cook book and offered for purchase to all the school community.

To submit a recipe we need to have the following included:

- Recipe Title Eg. Spaghetti Bolognese or Uncle Phil's famous pie.
- · Author of the recipe and family/child submitting the recipe.
- Recipe Category the dish most fits into. Eg. Main, Entrée, Beverage, Allergy Friendly
- Full ingredients listing and quantity of each ingredient needed.
- Kitchen items needed for completing the recipe would be handy but, not essential
- Full Recipe Method detailing exactly how to add the ingredients in the right order and using which kitchen items to complete the full dish – same as in recipe books you have at home
- Photo of your completed dish, if possible. NOTE: we can find a stock photo if you don't have one to submit.

You could even do a test run of your recipe at home to make sure nothing is missing from your recipe and take a photo of the finished product and of yourself with the dish too.

Once all recipes are received we will collate them and select at least one picture you have provided to accompany the recipe in the book.

We are also going to run a competition where one **Adult authored** recipe and one **Child authored** recipe will be selected at random to receive a copy of the published book for **free**. We are hoping to be able to provide the choice of purchasing a print copy and/or digital copy and will provide details of this in coming weeks.

A basic recipe template is provided if you'd like to use it or, just to use as a guide when you are getting your recipe ready for submission.



### Parking near a school.

- Do not park on or near a school crossing
- Do not double park and let your child out on the road.
- You cannot stay in the drop off/pick up zone for longer than two minutes or you will be issued with an infringement.

### Infringements

Council regularly patrols schools as part of our School Crossing Program. Council will issue infringements to anyone who does not obey signs or regulations. Infringements can be affixed to the vehicle or posted to the registered owner of the vehicle.

Make sure your child is waiting in the zone before you arrive

Offence	Offence description	Fine
Stopped in a 'no stopping' area	Drivers cannot stop, even briefly.	\$185
Stopped in a bus zone	Only public buses can stop here.	\$111
Parked for period longer than indicated	This is when you have overstayed the time limit indicated on the sign.	\$92
Stopped in a parking area for people with disabilities	You need a special disabled parking permit to park here. The permit number and expiry date must be visible from the outside.	\$185
Stopping on or near a children's crossing	A driver must not stop on a children's crossing, or on the road within 20 metres before, or 10 metres after the crossing.	\$185
Stopped on a footpath	You cannot leave your car standing on a footpath, it obstructs the path of pedestrians and is also very dangerous.	\$111
Stopped on or across a driveway or other way of access	No part of your vehicle can be parked or stopped across a driveway or other way of access.	\$111
Parked/stopped on a nature strip	A driver must not stop on a nature strip as it can obstruct the view of oncoming traffic and cause damage to infrastructure.	\$111
