Dear Parents and Carers,

Parent Teacher Interviews - Thursday 27th June

Mid-Year reports will be available for you to view on Compass Monday, 24th June. A lot of time goes into moderating various work and assessments your child has done so that teachers



can accurately provide you with a progression point and where your child is working at. It is important to remember that everyone learns at different speeds and has different areas of strengths and areas for further development.

Please take the time to read through your child's report before the Parent Teacher Interviews so that you can discuss any areas in further detail. In some cases it may be an opportunity to discuss specific areas where your child requires additional support or extension and what you can also do at home to support this.

Late Arrivals

I appreciate that we are almost at the end of term and how cold some of our mornings have been lately, but it is still crucial for your children to arrive at school on time. There seems to have been a significant increase in the amount of students who have been arriving late to school recently. At the beginning of every day, our students participate in Morning Circle, which helps to promote positive relationships with each other. They have an



opportunity to share important news, the values they will take extra focus on during that day and also what is happening throughout the day. We find that students who miss this opportunity can be anxious and less prepared and ready to learn.

Keilor Heights Primary School acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we meet and learn together, the Wurundjeri People of the Kulin Nation, and we recognise their enduring connection to the land, waters and culture. We pay our respects to their Elders past and present.



Classroom Observations

Over the past couple of weeks I have spent additional time in some classrooms during their Maths sessions. It has been really encouraging to see the development our students are making with the implementation of our new Maths model, especially with their ability to explain their reasoning and understanding of problems. One strategy that I observed, was peer tutoring, where students had to explain a process and then how to complete a problem to their peer.

Phonics in Schools

You may be aware of the recent communication in the media about Phonics being introduced into the school curriculum.



Every few years, the curriculum is reviewed and revised to make sure that it best meets the needs of our students and includes evidence based best practice. In 2025, all Victorian government schools need to be implementing the new curriculum for Numeracy, with Literacy to follow at a later date. We have begun to look at the new curriculum so that we are prepared and have incorporated aspects into our recent planning. Last week, Minister for Education, Ben Carroll, spoke about Phonics being part of the new curriculum. At Keilor Heights PS we already include the explicit teaching of Phonics through our Sound Waves program, so feel that we are already well prepared for any additional requirements that may be in the new curriculum.

<u>Chicken Soup with Pesto</u> Serves 4
Cooking Time: 35-40 minutes including prep

Ingredients

Soup

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 20g unsalted butter
- 1 leek (pale part only), thinly sliced
- 4 large chicken thighs, cut in 4-6 pieces
- 1 large potato, peeled, cut into 1cm cubes
- 1 litre chicken style liquid stock or vegetable liquid stock
- 400g can flageolet beans or cannellini beans, drained, rinsed
- 200g baby green beans, trimmed, cut into 2cm lengths
- 2 zucchinis, cut into 1 cm cubes
 1 cup (120g) frozen peas

Pesto

- 2 garlic cloves
- 1 cup basil leaves
- 2 tbsp toasted pine nuts
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1/3 cup (25g) grated parmesan

METHOD

Step 1

- For the pesto, place the garlic, basil leaves and pine nuts in a mortar or processor and pound or use a food processor and blend until you have a coarse paste.
- Stir in the olive oil and parmesan cheese, then season. Keep the pesto, covered, in the fridge for up to 1 week (it may discolour slightly but the flavour won't be affected).


Step 2

- Heat half the olive oil and butter in a large saucepan over medium heat.
- Add the chicken thigh pieces and fry to brown off the pieces for 2-3 minutes. Remove from pan and put aside on a plate with paper towel.
- Add remaining oil and butter and add leek and cook for 5 minutes or until softened.
- Add potato and stock and return cooked chicken, then bring to a simmer and cook for 10minutes.
- 5. Add the remaining ingredients, then season with salt and pepper and simmer for 10 minutes or until the vegetables are tender. Stir in 1 tablespoon of pesto, then serve in bowls with a side of crusty bread.

Notes: Can use white fish instead of chicken and so no need to cook fish off first depending on type of fish used. Can also leave out chicken and have as vegetarian sour.
