Anaphylaxis and Asthma Policies

Part of the role of School Council is to review various school polices. At our School Council meeting this week, we reviewed our Anaphylaxis, Asthma and Administration of Medication Policies. The Department provide schools with a recommended template that we can then adapt to suit our individual setting and needs. As part of this review, we were reminded of the need to communicate clearly with families regarding the development of individual Medical Management Plans (in conjunction with the ASCIA Action Plans). To make this communication clearer, we have now created a specific Medical Management Plan that we can use with individual families, where there might be a need for additional adjustments and considerations to be put in place. This is a good opportunity for families to contact the school if there have been any changes to your child's medical circumstances that we need to be aware of. At the beginning of every year, we ask families to check and update any personal details, including medical, so we can have the most up to date information. Meet the Teacher sessions at the beginning of the year are a perfect opportunity for you to discuss these Medical Management Plans. We also ask parents to check everything is up to date when we have an excursion or camp. Where there is an incursion or excursion that may require further adjustments and planning for your child, we ask parents to contact us so we can arrange a convenient meeting time to discuss these.

VISUAL ART Year 3/4





Students in Year 3 & 4 have been very busy making ancient Greek vases in Visual Art.

They started by researching vase designs, and drawing what they would like to create. Using a range of resources, they shaped their vase and covered it in paper mache.

They are now painting their vases and adding their intricate detailing. They are looking forward to taking their completed vases home.







In our unit about Antarctica, students completed experiments that helped them understand how animals in Antarctica keep warm. They are now creating their insulated shelter prototype using materials like polystyrene, foil and cardboard as part of their STEM mission. I am so proud to see the students so engaged and embracing new learning.
