
2025 Enrolments






KHPS Olympics









The Olympics are in full swing at KHPS! Classes have been learning about the countries participating and creating displays in their classrooms to show support.


On Friday, we will be holding our whole school Olympics Day. Students are encouraged to dress in the colours of their classes' allocated country.



















The Year 3/4's have been working on composing poetry. They have studied three main types of poems: Haiku, Shape and Quatrain.

Visual Art with Year 5/6














