

2025 Staff and Structure

We are working our way through the Recruitment process to confirm staffing for next year. This should be finalised by Week 9, and students and families will know their classroom teacher for our whole school 'Step Up Day' on Tuesday 10th

Over the coming weeks, students will be involved in our transition process, where they will have opportunities to mix with students from across their 2025 cohort.




