This morning I received a phone call from Minister for Education, Ben Carroll to let us know that we will be receiving \$497,793 dollars to upgrade our Junior Toilet block, complete some much needed roof and gutter repairs and drainage issues.



This is a result from a Grant School Council applied for and through our recent Rolling Facilities Evaluation (RFE). Thank you to Phoebe, from School Council, who spent a lot of time putting the grant applicant together and Chris B for helping with the RFE. This is only the first stage, so I cannot advise when the actual work will commence, as it will be a similar process that we went through with the oval, though in this case we should not be hindered by weather.

This additional money will certainly help improve our facilities and hopefully free up some money so we can look at upgrading our asphalt playing areas with a synthetic surface or grass.

Inter-school Swimming 2025 (Years 3-6)

Next year's Buckley District Interschool Swimming Carnival for students in years 3-6 will be held on Wednesday 26th of February, at Oak Park Sports and Aquatic Centre, Pascoe Vale.

On that day, participants will be required to make their own way with a parent/guardian as there is unlikely to be any staff from KHPS attending.

In order for students to qualify for this event, we will need to hold KHPS 50m swimming trials at the East Keilor Leisure Centre, Quinn Grove, Keilor East, on Monday the 17th of February after school between 3.45-5.00pm.

It is expected that students wishing to trial are competent in their stroke and are capable of swimming a competitive time. Generally these are students who swim in squads or have many years of swimming experience.

There will be a pool entry cost for students to participate in the trials. If you wish for your year 3-6 child to take part in the trials, please contact either the office or Mr Matton, through Compass no later than 5.00 p.m, by Wednesday 12th of February to express your child's interest. At that time, you will then be sent a permission form for the trials via Compass.

All events at the carnival are 50m and students are able to qualify for two individual events (out of Freestyle, Backstroke, Breaststroke and Butterfly) as well as the Freestyle relay (this is the only relay option available and is subject to having enough swimmers to put a team together) in the age groups as follows:

Boys 8/9/10 year olds (born 2015/2016/2017)

Girls 8/9/10 year olds (born 2015/2016/2017)

Boys 11 year olds (born 2014)

Girls 11 year olds (born 2014)

Boys 12/13 year olds (born 2012/2013)

Girls 12/13 year olds (born 2012/2013)
