5/6 BLACKOUT POETRY


The wind pushed against the old fishing boat as dark clouds rolled across the sky. Waves crashed heavily against the sides, spraying icy water over the deck.



📅 Weekly Recap: World Environment Week!

🌿 What an incredible, green-filled week we had in after-care! To celebrate World Environment Week, our students stepped up as planet protectors, eco-artists, and sustainability champions. Here is a look back at how we spent our days learning about, respecting, and protecting our beautiful Earth:

📅 What We Did Each Day

• Monday: Eco-Friendly Kickoff & Plastic Audits

o The Activity: We kicked off the week by looking at our own footprint. Kids decorated their own reusable canvas tote bags to take home, reducing the need for plastic bags.

o The Highlight: We did a mini "waste audit" after snack time to see how much we could compost and recycle instead of throwing in the trash!

• Tuesday: Trash to Treasure Art

o The Activity: The creative juices were flowing! Using bottle caps, cardboard boxes, and old magazines, the kids built incredible "Recycled Robots" and mosaic art.

o The Highlight: Seeing the kids realize that "waste" can actually be the perfect art supply.

• Wednesday: Seed Planting & The Circle of Life

o The Activity: Getting our hands dirty! Every child planted their own herb or flower seed in biodegradable starter cups (and some used decorated egg cartons!).

o The Highlight: Learning about how plants help the air we breathe. Check your child's backpack—these sprouts are ready for some windowsill sunlight at home!

Thursday: The Great Energy-Saving Hunt

o The Activity: We turned into Eco-Detectives. Armed with a checklist, the kids went around the facility hunting for ways to save energy (turning off unused lights, checking for dripping taps, and unplugging idle electronics).

o The Highlight: The kids took this very seriously and even promised to do an energy hunt at home!

• Friday: Nature Walk & "Leave No Trace" Celebration

o The Activity: We took our fun outdoors for a mindful nature walk, collecting interesting fallen leaves and sticks for a collaborative group nature mandala.

o The Highlight: We wrapped up the week with an outdoor picnic, practicing our "Leave No Trace" rule by leaving our play area cleaner than we found it.
