NAPLAN



NAPLAN assessments for students in Years 3 and 5 will occur between March 12th and March 24th. Teachers are providing support for students during class by building stamina, practicing test conditions, strategies for answering multiple choice questions as well as the usual literacy and numeracy work. This helps students to feel comfortable during the testing time and that it is no different to the usual assessments they do throughout the year. It is important to remember that NAPLAN provides a snapshot of where your child is at with their learning and it is used alongside other school based assessments to inform teachers about goals and planning.

What are Year 1/2's learning in PE?

Students in Year 1 and Year 2 have been practising their Overarm Throwing skills. Students in Year 1 have been practising starting in the 'ready' position, stepping forwards with their opposite foot and following through with their throwing arm. Year 2 students have been modifying their technique to include a side-on stance, as well as focus on throwing at a target with greater consistency. Students have participated in different skill practise activities as well as a team-based target game called 'Pole Battle'.

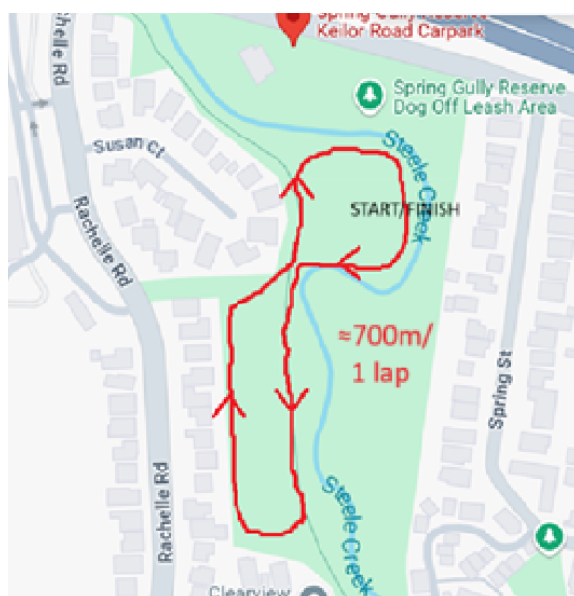




KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials (Years 3-6)

This year's **KHPS House Cross-Country/Buckley District Interschool Cross-Country Trials** for students in years 3-6 will take place on Tuesday, April 1st. On this day, all students and teachers in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will walk down to Steele's Creek/Spring Gully Reserve in Keilor East (near Valley Lakes) to run/walk either $\approx 2\text{km}/3$ laps (10 years old this year and younger) or $\approx 3\text{km}/4$ laps (11 years old this year and older). Every lap completed of the circuit will earn house points, in addition to extra points being awarded for the top 10 finishers, which will go towards awarding the House Cross-Country Shield for 2025.

The event is also a qualification opportunity for students (top 8 in each age group/gender) who are keen runners and have ambitions to represent KHPS at the Buckley District Cross-Country Event which will be held in Term 2, Week 3, at Brimbank Park.



Students may have different goals on the House Cross-Country day but the focus will be on having fun, being active, and doing their best to run/walk as many laps as they can in the allocated time.

On the day, Year 3/4 students (10 years and under) will walk down with their teachers promptly at 9.10 am and return to school at approximately 11.15 am. Year 5/6 students (11 years old and older) will walk down with their teachers at 10.10 am and return to school by approximately 12.30 pm.

In the case of students in Year 4 who are turning or have turned 11 in 2025, or Year 5 who are turning or have turned 10 in 2025, students will be asked prior to the day to choose whether they want to run for fun (and walk down) with their class/peer group, or run to compete and trial for interschool cross-country (and walk down) with their age group.

You will previously have consented to the 2025 General Incursion/Excursion form on Compass which is sufficient for students attending this event. Parents/guardians who have not given consent will receive a reminder via Compass. Please ensure this is actioned prior to the day so that your child is able to attend.

10 and under girls (Generally Years 3 and 4, students born in 2015 or later)	9.40-10.10
10 and under boys (Generally Years 3 and 4, students born in 2015 or later)	10.15-10.45
11 years old- girls and boys (Generally Year 5, students born in 2014)	10.55-11.25
12/13 years old- girls and boys (Generally Year 6, students born in 2013 or earlier)	11.30-12.00

Students are encouraged to wear appropriate clothing for physical activity that also displays their house colours. If your child does not have anything to wear, face paint, headbands, hair accessories etc. are alternative ways to demonstrate house pride. Students will need to take a water bottle and sun smart hat along to the event, and are encouraged to apply sunscreen prior to coming to school.

Parents and guardians are welcome to come down and spectate but will need to remain at the assembly area/start & finish line while students are competing in their events.

Some parent helpers will be required so if you are able to provide assistance throughout the morning then please let Mr Matton know in person or via Compass beforehand.

If you have any questions please don't hesitate to get in contact with Mr Matton.

UPDATE ON MINOR HEAD INJURIES AT SCHOOL

The policy on contacting parents/carers on head injuries at school as changed slightly and you will not always receive a phone call from the school if your child has attended sick bay due to a head injury.

Following assessment and First Aid care, we will send a First Aid notification via Compass so you are aware your child had a head injury but it has been assessed as minor and concussion is not suspected. You will then be able to monitor at home if the condition changes.

If you receive a notification via Compass and a phone call this is because concussion may be suspected or there is a visible mark or bruise, you may be asked to pick your child up or they may stay at school and be monitored, if they return to First Aid we will then call for pick up.

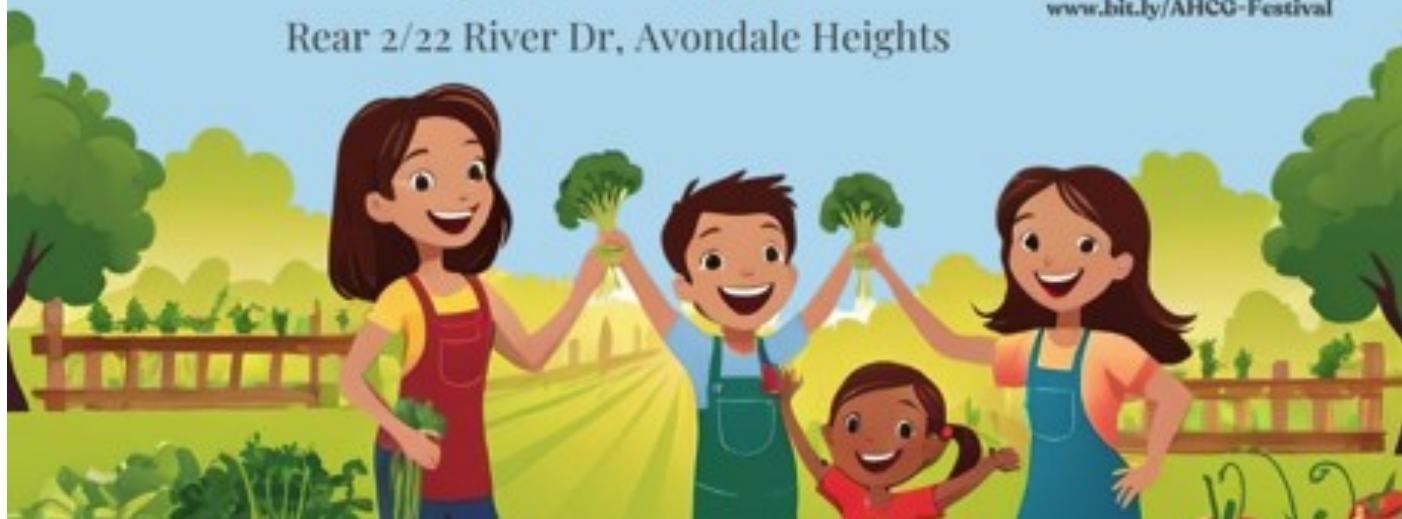
